## DISCUSSION

<u>Votes</u> volunteers engaged over 400 citizens regarding the importance of registering and then voting. As a result of this initiative 75 eligible citizens registered to vote and 145 secured their registration with an address/name change. Be sure to recommend neighbors, friends, co-workers go to the <u>My Vote</u> website. It is simple and efficient in assisting with voter registration questions. Explore it! Try it! Note: in Eau Claire County, there are 25,000 people eligible to vote who have NOT registered.

**100**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary of Women's Right to Vote**, **1920-2020-** Jean Glanzman shared plans for local activities and celebration in the making for next year. She would like to develop a traveling exhibit and seeks resources from the area. Various ideas included: Jane Peterson, UW-EC Study Center, League of Women Voters, CVLR Speaker's group, Chippewa Valley Museum, UW-EC archives. This could be a great way to get involved with civic activities that promote democracy – stay tuned.

<u>Whistle Blower's Report</u> — Much discussion on the implications for current administration AND current congressional members. Will we finally follow the laws governing constitutional integrity? This likely will take center stage for next several months; questions about how this will impact Democratic presidential candidates — especially Joe Biden's candidacy- discussed the potential fallout for him...

**Sen. Elizabeth Warren** plans to introduce legislation this fall to rescind 20 Medals of Honor awarded to U.S. soldiers who slaughtered hundreds of Lakota Indians — mostly women and children — in the Wounded Knee Massacre of 1890. The bill, the Remove the Stain Act, was introduced in the House in June; Warren said she'll introduce a Senate version in the coming months.
